MISCELLANEOUS AND SERIES NOTES

- Miami's matchup with Nebraska marked the 12th all-time meeting between the two schools. The all-time series is now tied at 6-6.
- Miami improved its all-time record to 604-348-19.
- The Hurricanes improved to 12-1 against non-conference opponents at home against AI Golden. In addition, Miami is 12-2 against non-conference opponents in their first trip to Sun Life Stadium.
- Miami is also 15-3 in its last 18 home games.
- Miami owns an overall record of 21-8 in four seasons at home at Sun Life Stadium under head coach Al Golden.
- Al Golden improves to 31-22 at the University of Miami and 57-56 overall.
- The Canes scored their second touchdown with 8:04 remaining in the first quarter. It is Miami's fastest lead of 14 or more points to start a game since Nov. 29, 2013 (at Pitt).
- Miami led by 17 or more points after the first quarter for the first time since Sep. 21, 2013 (vs. Savannah State, 21-0). The last time the Hurricanes led an FBS opponent by 17 or more points after the first quarter was on Sep. 22, 2012 (at Georgia Tech, 19-0).

- The Hurricanes have scored on their first offensive series of the game in each of the last five weeks dating back to last season. Miami is now 26-10 under Al Golden when scoring first and 26-2 when leading at halftime.
- Miami scored two touchdowns in the first quarter in back to back games for the first time since October 4-11, 2014.

OFFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Sophomore QB Brad Kaaya has thrown a touchdown pass in 16-consecutive games. The only Miami quarterback in the last 20 years with a longer streak is Ken Dorsey. Dorsey had streaks of 23 and 17 games in his career.
- Kaaya recorded 226 passing yards in the first half. It is the third most passing yards in any half of his career (240 vs. in first half vs. Florida State on Nov. 15, 2014, 227 in first half vs. Arkansas State on Sep. 13, 2014).
- Kaaya surpassed 300-yards through the air for the fourth time as a Hurricane as he tallied a career-high 379 yards. He has now eclipsed 200-yards passing 11 times in his career.
- Kaaya's fourth quarter interception marked the first time in 110 attempts that he has been picked off.
- Senior Deon Bush made his 23rd career start. Bush has the most career starts on the team.
- Kaaya, offensive lineman Danny Isidora and linebacker Raphael Kirby all tallied their 16th-consecutive starts.
- Senior WR Rashawn Scott tallied a career high nine receptions. He also finished with 151 yards receiving. Scott's 100-yard game is the fourth of his career and the second this season.
- Sophomore RB Joe Yearby scored a touchdown for the third-consecutive game. He also logged his second-consecutive 100-yard game as he finished with 125 rushing yards.
- Freshman RB Mark Walton rushed for a career-high three touchdowns. He is the first Hurricane running back since Mike James do so on Sept. 22, 2012 in an overtime win at Georgia Tech.
- Sophomore K Michael Badgley drilled a career-high four field goals (41, 27, 23 and 28). Badgley is 7-for-7 for his career in field goals between 40-49 yards.
- Sophomores Chris Herndon and Tyre Brady both logged their first career touchdown reception.

DEFENSIVE INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- CB Artie Burns became the sixth Cane in the last 20 years with three interceptions over a three-game span joining Sean Taylor, Ed Reed, Phillip Buchanon, Kenny Phillips and Kelly Jennings (via AP).
- Burns became the first player with an interception in three consecutive games since Sean Taylor in 2003 (via AP).
- S Deon Bush recorded his first interception of the season.
- DL tallied Anthony Moten recorded his first career sack.

Nebraska Post-Game Notes

Nebraska at Miami, Sept. 19, 2015, Sun Life Stadium

- * Nebraska fell to 8-2 all-time in overtime games. The Huskers had won three straight overtime games dating back to a loss at Texas Tech on Oct. 11, 2008.
- * Nebraska fell short of what would have been the largest comeback in school history. The Huskers trailed by 23 points (33-17) with less than nine minutes remaining in the fourth quarter before scoring three consecutive touchdowns and converting a pair of two-point conversions to tie the game at 33-33. The record for the largest comeback in school history is 21 points vs. Ohio State in 2011, and the Nebraska record for largest fourth-quarter comeback is 12 points, accomplished three times.
- * **Tommy Armstrong Jr.** accounted for 358 yards of total offense in today's game. With the 358 yards, Armstrong moved past Jerry Tagge, Jammal Lord, Joe Ganz and Tommie Frazier to climb to fourth on the NU career total offense list. Armstrong now has 5,521 career total offense yards and six career games with 300 yards of total offense.
- * Armstrong passed for 301 yards today, giving him six straight games with at least 200 yards passing. It was his third career 300-yard passing game - all in Nebraska' last four games, including twice in three games this season.
- * After halftime, Armstrong threw for 244 yards and four touchdowns. In the fourth quarter, Armstrong completed 11-of-20 passes for 184 yards and four touchdowns. He accounted for 204 yards of total offense in the fourth quarter alone, adding 20 rushing yards, including a 16-yard gain on a 3rd-and-13 play that set up his game-tying touchdown pass to Stanley Morgan Jr. two plays later.
- * Armstrong rushed for 49 yards, moving him within 38 yards of reaching 1,000 career rushing yards (962). Armstrong would be the 10th Nebraska quarterback to rush for 1,000 yards in a career.
- * Junior wide receiver **Jordan Westerkamp** had a 22-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter. Westerkamp has had a touchdown reception in four consecutive games, including last year's Holiday Bowl.
- * Westerkamp finished with five receptions for 95 yards. With his 95 receiving yards, Westerkamp increased his career yardage total to 1,263 and moved up two spots to 11th on the Nebraska career receiving yardage list. He passed Irving Fryar (1,196) and Matt Herian (1,243) in today's game.
- * Westerkamp had a 24-yard punt return in the second quarter. The return was a career long, bettering his 19-yard return at Minnesota in 2013.
- * **Stanley Morgan Jr.** set career highs with four catches for 78 yards and one touchdown. His first career touchdown catch helped Nebraska tie the game at 33-33 with 33 seconds remaining in regulation.
- * **Drew Brown's** 49-yard field goal in the second quarter was a career long, bettering a 44-yarder against Florida Atlantic in the 2014 season opener.
- * Redshirt freshman defensive end **Freedom Akinmoladun** had a 12-yard sack in the second quarter, his second career sack. Akinmoladun has had at least one tackle for loss in all three games this season.
- * Junior running back **Terrell Newby** rushed 14 times for 82 yards. Newby moved within 54 yards of reaching 1,000 career yards (946).
- * Miami's victory evened the all-time series between the schools at 6-6. The Hurricanes have a 5-1 lead in games in Miami.
- * Today's game was Nebraska's first regular-season game in the state of Florida since a 1951 loss to the Hurricanes.
- * Nebraska dropped its road opener for the first time since 2012, after winning its road opener each of the past two seasons.
- * Nebraska dropped to 1-2 for the first time since 1981. The Huskers won their final eight regular-season games that year to finish 9-2.
- * Nebraska scored at least three touchdowns for the 17th consecutive game.
